RE:	Read to Achieve Grade 3 Results

The North Carolina Charter School Law - G.S. 115C-218.85(b)(4) - requires a charter school to post specific performance details on the website by September 1 of each year. These details correspond with the Read to Achieve law that focuses upon third grade reading proficiency, and those requirements are listed below for your information:

- The number and percentage of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students demonstrating and not demonstrating reading proficiency on the State-approved standardized test of reading comprehension administered to 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students.
- The number and percentage of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students not demonstrating reading proficiency who do not return to the charter school for the following school year.
- The number and percentage of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students who take and pass the alternative assessment of reading comprehension.
- The number and percentage of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students exempt from mandatory 3<sup>rd</sup> grade retention by category of exemption.

To assist schools, the NC Department of Public Instruction has created a standardized document that schools can post on their website, and the document attached behind this letter fulfills the annual requirement. As you review the document regarding the student 3<sup>rd</sup> grade reading proficiency, focus your attention on the fifth item. NCVA did not retain 36.3% of the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students. We utilized multiple strategies within the law in order to work with students and families to address any reading deficiencies.

As we begin our third year of operation, we continue to improve our data-driven instruction to proactively identify and remediate struggling readers. Our desire is to address any reading gaps before a student ever reaches 3<sup>rd</sup> grade.
